| HERBS | |
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| Sweet Genovese Basil | Sweet full flavor, up to 2" leaves. Italian variety, pesto & all cooking types. Best flavored sweet basil from Genoa region, Italy. Tender Annual. |
| Cinnamon Basil | Rich, well-drained, soil. Full sun. Spicy-Sweet Flavor Showy Purple Stems! Strong cinnamon scent. Use leaves fresh or dried in tomato dishes, pasta sauces, vegetable & soups. Also a companion plant to repel aphids, mites, and tomato hornworms. |
| Thai Basil | 75-80 Days. Tender Annual, fragrant, flavorful. Use in Thai, Vietnamese, & ethnic cuisine. Spicy, licorice flavored shoots & leaves used in salads, soups and curries. Fairly bushy plant growth w/purple stems & flowers. |
| Lemon Basil | 80 Days. Tropical plant needs direct sunlight min.6 hrs a day. Fresh citrus lemon basil scent, nice mild flavor is a must have in your garden. Delicious flavor on grilled fish, shrimp, pasta dishes, vegetable & chicken. |
| Purple Basil | Large, 3" quilted leaves adds extra cinnamon flavor to your cooking than regular basil. Great ornamental for containers or a distinctive garnish. Small % plants will be green, thin when identified. |
| VEGGIES | |
| Brussels Sprouts, Long Island Improved | 90 Days High yields of flavorful Brussels Sprouts. This variety is great for freezing! |
| Broccoli, Calabrese | 58-90 Days from transplant. Popular market variety w/tight heads can reach 8" in diameter. After the central head is harvested, side shoots follow. |
| Cabbage Red Danish | 95 days - Fine quality, favorite since 1889! Solid heads weighing 6-8lbs.each w/delicious flavor. Excellent storing cabbage! |

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| Cauliflower, Early pearl | 90 days – A delicious choice! Pure white heads grow large & tasty, w/good coverage by outer leaves. Excellent cauliflower for fall planting. |
| Cucumber - Lemon | 65-70 Days. Rich, well-drained soil best for cucumbers. Excellent soil additive: processed manure/compost. Harvest when golf ball size for best texture and flavor. Nice variety for cool short season climates. Fruit looks like a round lemon, not a cucumber. Sweet Flavor, good in salads! |
| Cucumber - Diva | 58 days. Cucumis sativus. (F1) Produces good yields of non-bitter burpless, seedless glossy dark green cucumbers. Produces w/out pollination! Good in home gardens, greenhouse, and market growers. Excellent for salads or pickling. |
| Cucumber - Pickle | 55 days. Cucumis sativus. Heavy yields small green cucumbers. Especially bred for making pickles. Solid, crisp w/superb flavor! |
| Eggplant - Orient Charm (light purple) | 65 Days. Fruits of the Orient Express shape, but with alluring shades of fluorescent pink, pastel pink, and white with green calyx. Strong plant with high yields. |
| Eggplant, Black Beauty | 80 days — Broad, dark purple egg-shaped fruits that range four 4-6", borne well off ground on med sized plants. |
| Eggplant - Orient Express (dark purple) | 58 Days. Slender glossy black Asian eggplant 8-10" long. Mild flesh, delicate flavor. Matures quickly, sets fruit in a wide range of temps, allowing to harvest longer. Enjoy grilled, roasted, or stir-fried. |
| Armenian Cukes | 63 days. Cucumis sativus. Yields dark & light green striped cucumbers. Best when harvested between 8" & 18" long. Grows w/curve if grown on ground. Use trellis for straight cucumbers. Excellent slicer, perfect for salads. |
| Purple Orach, Mountain Spinach | Orach is a hardy annual plant. The leaves are variously shaped, somewhat oblong, comparatively thin and slightly acidulous to the taste. Orach is best when grown in a rich, deep and moist soil, and is cultivated in the same manner as spinach. |
| Lettuce Romain, Freckles | 55 Days. Early spring. 3-4 wks before first frost, successive plantings thereafter every 3 wks until 2 wks before 1st fall frost. Heat tolerant (rare for Romaines) & very tasty. Austrians call Freckles "forellenschuss" translates "trout, self enclosing", indicating a speckled romaine. |
| Collards | 80 Days. Nice, even supply H ₂ O. Regularly apply 1-1.5" water per wk when no rain. Measure amount of H ₂ O w/rain gauge left in garden. Mulch w/compost, finely ground leaves, weed-free hay, or finely ground bark to keep soil cool, moist, keeps down weeds, & helps keep leaves clean. |

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| Watermelon, Sugar Baby | 80 days. Standard icebox melons, staple at picnics for years. Vines grow to 6 feet and set 4-6 melons, 10" across. Unmistakable crisp, mouthwatering, sweet rich flavor. Terrific for home gardens! |
| Rocky Ford Melon | 90 Days. Cucumis melo. Plant produces good yields of 5" diameter round cantaloupes. The green flesh is sweet with a spicy distinct flavor. This variety does well in the Southern states. Excellent for home gardens. |
| Pumpkin, Sugar Pie | 95 Days. Cucurbita pepo. Produces yields of 10" diameter, bright orange yellow pumpkin. One of the best pumpkins for pumpkin pies! |
| Pumpkin, French Cinderella | Classically beautiful, oblate, & deeply ribbed. Striking orange, red color when fully ripe. Good flavored flesh, perfect to carve into Jack-O-Lanterns. |
| Pumpkin, Jack Be Little Pumpkin | 105 Days. Cucurbita pepo. Produces tiny 4" wide orange pumpkins. Very attractive making Halloween & Thanksgiving decorations. |
| Pumpkins, Jack O' Lantern | 110 Days. Variety bred specifically for carving Jack O' Lanterns, also good for making pumpkin pies as well. Deep orange color, 18-24 lbs. pumpkins grow from very long vines. Thick stems make sturdy tops for Jack O' Lanterns. |
| Summer Squash - Crookneck | 58 days. Creamy crookneck is mild, sweet, & full of flavor. Grows 2 feet high, 3-4 feet wide. Won't take over the garden, and easily harvested fruit. |
| Summer Squash - Pattypan | 45-70 Days. Shaped balls w/flattened, scalloped edges. Any combo of white, green, & yellow. A tender summer squash, like zucchini or yellow squash. Scalloped flying saucer shape makes them a novelty, & difficult to figure out how to slice. Eat & cook like any summer squash. |
| Summer Squash - Yellow Squash | Warm, well-drained location, and fertile soil. Categorized as summer or winter varieties. Immature fruits of summer varieties are eaten fresh. Winter squash harvest late fall when mature and the skins toughen. Stored in cool, dry location, used into the winter. |
| Summer Squash Black Beauty Green-Zucchini | 60 Days — At usable stage, the fruits are six to eight inches by two inches and dark green. Black-green to almost black at maturity. |
| Zucchini Costato Romanesco - Ribbed Zuke | 52-60 Days. Zucchini type. Large, big-leafed plants bear up to 20lbs. fruit. Prominent gray-green & pale-green ribs and flecks. Italian type. Good producer of male blossom buds. |
| Winter Squash - Delecata | 100 Days - Popular variety w/fine, sweet potato-like flavor. Vines produce fruits 3" diameter & 6-8" long, cream color w/ green stripes from blossom to the stem end. |
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| Winter Squash - Butternut | 85 Days - Light tan, 7-9" long w/thick neck, small seed cavity. Flesh is a wonderful, bright orange. |
| Winter Squash - Buttercup | 100 Days-Good maritime variety. Sweet, fine-grained flesh, 5-8" diameter ranging from 3-5 lbs. Flattened turban shape w/blossom end button. Optimum conditions, vines reach 15ft., set 20+ fruits per vine! |
| Winter Squash, Spaghetti | 70 Days. Harvest 8-10" long. Remove pulp easily w/fork after boiling in shell for 30 minutes. Also bakes well. |
| PEPPERS | |
| SWEET/MILD | |
| Green Bell Pepper, California Wonder | 75 Days - Plants are upright, strong, & produce 4-5 fruits mostly four-lobed, blocky, & 4 by 4½" w/thick flesh that's mild and sweet. |
| Yellow Bell -ps California wonder Gold | 70 Days -Same as California Wonder but the peppers are a bright gold, changing to orange-red when mature. |
| Angugua, Big Long Sweet | 75 Days. White w/streaks of violet that fade to soft lavender. Grows 8" long and 3" across w/creamy white flesh, tender & very mild-tasting. Productive plants bear throughout a long season. |
| Purple Bell | 18-22" Tender Annual. 70-80 Days. Full Sun. Moderate Water. Ready when fruit turns deep purple w/green undertone. Crisp, succulent, 4-lobed, thick-walled fruit. Very productive. |
| Sweet Italian Tollies | 85 Days. Capsicum Annum. 5" long red sweet peppers. Very sweet, w/ thick walls, turning green to red when mature. Plant has green stems, green leaves, & white flowers. Eat fresh in salads or added to tomato sauce. |
| MEDIUM | |
| Ancho/Poblano | 90-110 Days. Moderate Water. Full Sun. Tender Annual. Dark green turning to red when mature. Poblano fresh, Ancho dried. Enrich soil w/mature compost, warm conditions day & night to germinate & fruit well. Tip: Harvest in green or red stage. |
| Anaheim | 80 Days- Pods 6-8½" long x 1½". Tapered, med thick, pungent, deep green, turning to red at maturity. Tall, upright, bushy, & long bearing plant. Use fresh, canned or dried. |

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| HOT | |
| Habenero | 95 Days. Transplants add 8-10 wks. Space 18-24" apart. Full sun. Delicious, pungent, smoky quality unlike other peppers; Flavor & aroma irresistible in sauces and salsas. |
| Jalapeno | 70 Days. Use fresh, in salsa, pickled, canned, dried & make into jelly at both red/green stage. Add to chili, soups for a spicy flavor. Great stuffed or baked! |
| Serrano | 85 Days. Hot, pungent fruit 2½-4" long x 1/2". Slim, club shaped green peppers w/med thin walls matures bright red color on 30" tall plants. "Serrano" translates "from the mountains". Picked fresh & used to for salsas |
| Purple Ornamental | Warm soil, nights reliably mild. Perfect for containers of all kinds, but you'll have to put some in the garden, too -- color this rich is just too good not to spread around! |
| Cayenne | 70 Days. HOT, delightfully pungent flavor! Pickling, canning or drying. 6" long, 1/2 thin, green fruits turning red when mature. |
| Bulgarian Carrot Chili | 85-95 Days. Capsicum annum Heirloom. Full Sun. Moderate Water. Vibrant orange, 2-3 in. carrot-shaped. Satisfies the chili aficionado w/consistent heat & fine flavor. Productive variety w/dense foliage protecting fruit from sun scald. |
| Prairie Fire | 90-100 Days. Culinary & ornamental hot pepper. Green to yellow at intermediate, red at full maturity. Upright tapered fruit atop of a small plant. Great bedding, pot production, borders. Great for holiday sales. |
| Moonflower | Annual. Fragrant flowers bloom on vines growing up to 20 feet. Old fashioned 6" flowers blooms late afternoon, throughout the night into morning. On a cool cloudy day will stay open until noon. |
| TOMATOES | |
| Container | |
| Kimberly | 68 Days. This tomato sets well in warmer growing regions and produces well into autumn. Great tomato for patio or container garden. Surprisingly good flavor for such an early tomato and some say better tasting than Stupice. |
| Early | |
| Mrs. Maxwell's Big Italian | 69 Days. Intermediate. Large prolific, indeterminate, potato-leaf plants. 1-2lbs., 3-4", dark-pink beefsteak tomatoes w/incredible flavor. Perfect to eat fresh off the vine, canning tomato, or cooking into a tomato sauce! |

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| Bloody Butcher | 55 Days. Early producing. Indeterminate, vigorous, potato-leaf pla.2", 4 oz, deep-red color, inside and out fruits. 5-9 fruits per cluster. Produces until frost. Good in cooler growing regions as fruits ripen quickly. Great canning tomato. |
| Glacier | 65 Days. Early, short-season, open-pollinated, potato-leaf variety that flowers when it is only 4" tall then sets loads of very flavorful 23oz, round, red tomatoes. Good flavor. |
| Legend | 68 Days. Strong tolerance of late blight fungus US8 & US11. Even virulent areas have a great chance to harvest ripe tomatoes. Earliest maturing slicing tomato known. Sweet tomatoes, right amount of acid flavor. 4-5" parthenocarpic fruit, glossy red, w/uniform round shape. |
| Taos | 65 Days. Produces 6-ft., indeterminate, regular-leaf. Crops of 6-8 oz., slightly-flattened, round, red tomatoes w/delicious sweet, zesty, moderately-acidic flavors. Hotter, dry growing conditions, produces well in cooler growing regions until frost. Good for canning tomato juice, & sliced for tomato salads. |
| Stupice | 52 Days. Cold-tolerant tomato bears abundance of very sweet, flavorful 2-3", deep red fruit. Wonderful sweet/acid, tomatoey flavor and production. |
| Ealiana | 68 Days. Indeterminate, regular-leaf plants. Clusters of 4-6, uniformly round, red-pink tomatoes. Perfect market tomato w/ visual appeal & sweet/tart flavors. Produces until frost, w/good disease resistance. Prolific for cooler growing regions. Good salad & canning tomato. |
| Marmande | 67 Days. Clusters of 6oz deep red, slightly flattened, meaty oblate fruits. Lightly lobed, contains a complex, slightly tart taste. Cooler summer conditions best. An all-round great tomato for slicing. |
| Cherry | 80 days, indeterminate - Interesting small, mostly 1oz globe-shaped yellow & red bicolor fruits. Size not consistent range from 1-2" diameter. Excellent flavor - sweet and juicy. |
| Green Doctor new | 80 Days. Indeterminate., regular leaf, round green cherries that grow in clusters of 6-10. Fruits turn yellowish-green when fully ripe. The flavor is somewhat bland at the very beginning of the season but gradually improves to excellent sweet flavor. |
| Chadwick | 70 Days. Flavorful, 1", red fruits borne in vigorous clusters of 6. Add these cherry tomato seeds to your collection of cherry tomatoes and taste the difference. |

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| Cherry Berry (Brown Berry) | 72 Days. Vigorous, indeterminate, regular-leaf. Large mahogany (brick-red) brown colored, 1", round, open-pollinated cherry tomatoes. Very juicy, semi-sweet, rich flavors. Great snacking, & salad tomato to mix w/other colored tomatoes. |
| Isis Candy | 67 Days. 1" round, yellow w/red tinge & marbling. Gold flesh. Typically a 'cat's eye' star of yellow on one end of fruit. Sweet taste rich and fruity. Favorite "candy" treat w/kids. |
| Peacevine | 65 Days. High amino acid content has calming effect on the body which has earned its name. Indeterminate variety w/"the highest Vitamin C content in a cherry tomato among 30 varieties." |
| Sungold | 57 Days. Ripens to a golden orange. Sweetest cherry tomato around. bearing lots of fruit, ripening early, continuing to produce throughout the season. Single large plant produces over 1000 tomatoes. |
| Porters Dark Plum | 74 Days. Excellent yields variety producing in clusters of 6-10. Oblong, small, pink, plum-shaped (oval) fruit with a rich tomatoey flavor. Good for snacking, canning and juice. A long-season variety. A really great tomato! |
| Yellow Pear | 71 Days. Large quantities 1 oz., 1 1/2", bright yellow, pear-shaped cherry tomatoes that fruit until frost! Zesty sweet & delicious. A beautiful salad or snackin' tomato. Great choice for patio or planter garden. Good producer even in cooler coastal regions. |
| COLORS | |
| Black Ethiopian | 81 Days. A favorite Russian heirloom tomato. Originally from the Ukraine region. Our Organic tomato seeds produce vigorous indeterminate, regular-leaf tomato plants that yield copious amounts of red-mahogany-bronze, 5-oz., plum-shaped fruit. Exceptional, rich, fruity, tangy taste. Rare tomato seeds. TomatoFest is one of the only commercial sources for this favorite black tomato seed. |
| Black From Tula | 75 Days. Largest of the black tomatoes with 3-4", slightly flattened, oblate, dark brown to purple fruit with deep green shoulders. Deliciously outstanding, rich, slightly salty, smoky-fruit flavor.!! For a truly wonderful black tomato this one is sure to please. |
| Black Krim | 75 Days. Rare yields 3-4" slightly flattened dark-red (mahogany-colored) slightly maroon, w/deep green shoulders. Green gel around seeds. Fantastic, intense, slightly salty taste. Container/patio garden. Used for slicing, salads & cooking. |
| Cherokee Purple (slicing) | 80 Days. Produces dusky rose to purple colored, 12 oz.-1 lb., fruit w/deep red colors to the interior flesh and dark shoulders. Rich, complex and sweet flavors. . |

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| Moonglow | 80 Days. Indeterminate, regular-leaf. Yields 6-8 oz., 2", blunt-pointed globes. Warm-orange slicer w/great flavor. Best texture & flavor of any yellow-gold tomato. Long shelf-life & delicious taste. |
| Gold Medal | 85 Days. 1-1/2 lb., yellow & red bi-color fruit w/pink marbling in blossom end, thin skin & luscious sweet, well-balanced flavors. After harvest fruit lasts 2 wks before loosing it's beauty. |
| Aunt Ruby's Green | 79 Days. Slightly flattened, 1lbs fruit, ripens to pale greenish-yellow ("lime jello green") w/slight pink blush extending inside. Superb, fruity sweet & slightly spicy taste. |
| Golden Sun Ray | 75 Days. Tall, sprawling, indeterminate, regular-leaf plant. Moderate/heavy loads, 8-10 oz., smooth, round, golden-orange. Sweet balanced flavor w/right amount acidity. Produces well even in hot, dryer growing regions. Salads, fresh, or sauce tomato. |
| Brandywine Purple | 75 Days. Very much like potato-leaf Brandywine, but 3 inch fruit is darker pink to purple. This is a very meaty heirloom tomato with good flavors. |
| Beefsteaks Slicing | 70 Days. These large, juicy, fruits combine old-fashioned beefsteak flavor with heavy yields. 1-pound, round to globe-shaped. Flavor is full and hearty with lots of sweet juice balanced with that wonderful tomato acidity. These giants slice up perfectly for big sandwiches. Fruit stays large even at the end of a long harvest season. |
| Balls Beefsteak | 76 Days. Big 14oz fruits. Perfect sandwich tomato w/old fashion flavor. Crack Resistant. Indeterminate. Disease Resistant |
| Brandywine | 80 Days. Legendary rich, succulent flavor. Reddish-pink, w/light, creamy flesh fruits. Average 12oz, can grow to 2lbs. |
| Mexico | 79 Days. Large, indeterminate, regular-leaf, prolific plant. 1-2lbs, slightly flattened, irregular-shaped, dark-pink fruit w/terrific bold, flavors. Sweetness w/complementary acid flavors. Slice fresh and thick for sandwiches, & salads. |
| Mortgage Lifter | 82 Days. The large, slightly flattened, pink-red fruits ranging 1-3lbs, meaty, very flavorful & have few tomato seeds. |
| Mule Team | 79 Days. Vigorous plant w/yields of 3", 8-12 oz., globes. Excellent mildly sweet flavor. Plant bears continuously till frost. Excellent taste. |
| Beefsteak Heirloom | 85 Days. Excellent productivity w/great taste. Lush, thick, indeterminate, regular-leaf. Yield s from vigorous vines, 4-5", slightly ribbed, bright-red & delicious, sweet flavors. Excellent taste, meaty flesh makes it ideal to eat fresh, cook, slice for sandwiches, salads, or canning! |
| Thessolonki | 80 Days Tender Annual Full Sun Moderate Water Mildly earthy, slightly acidic flavor. |
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| Hillbilly | 85 Days, Indeterminate. Slicing tomato. Sweet juicy 4-6" flattened fruits, 1 lb. each. Yellow fruits streaked w/red on the blossom end. Heavy producer. |
| Soldacki | 75 Days. Large 1lbs pink fruits. Very sweet turning from green to dark pink when mature. A heirloom variety from Krakow, Poland. Indeterminate. |
| Paste | |
| San Marzano | 78 Days. Compact, prolific producer of bright-red, slim, 2-3", plum-type, fruit over a long season. A paste tomato with pointy end, heavy walls & little juice, great for tomato sauce. Crack resistant. |
| Italian Roma | 78 Days. Standard paste tomato for making sauces and catsup! Strong vines yield up to 200 red, pear shaped fruit, 2-3oz each, w/firm flesh, few seeds. Determinate vines. A very popular variety! |
| Grushovka | 65 Days Siberian origin. Small (2-3-inch) plum-shaped, pink/red tomatoes on small plants. Good canning tomato. Very, very tasty. |
| TOMATILLOS | |
| Purple | 70 days. Unusual deep purple makes an ideal salsa w/sweet tart flavor. Striking purple veins in the leaves, light green to buff colored husks. Very decorative as a garnish. |
| Verde | 60 Days Early producing. Yields large green tomatillos. Papery husk turns from green to brown as they ripen & splits open when ready to harvest. Make salsa and other Mexican dishes! |
| FRUIT VINES AND CANES | |
| Concord Seedless Grape | Produce lots of delicious deep blue seedless grapes! |
| Canadice Seedless Grape | Ripens Mid September - Compact clusters w/sweet, medium size berries, flavor similar to Delaware. Ideal canning & freezing grape. |
| Lakemont Seedless Grape | Ripens Mid September non-slipskin, meaning flesh tends to attach to skin. Eat fresh & have a very honey taste! |
| KiwiGold Raspberry | May Zones 4-7 Full Sun Non-alkaline, fertile loam soil. Plentiful supply of moisture throughout the growing season. Ripens in August producing large berries w/ distinct flavor. |
| Heritage Red Raspberry | Summer Zones 4-9 Full Sun Tolerant of heavier soils, except poorly drained. Mild Flavor Superior quality for fresh eating, freezing, jams and jellies! |
